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Aims

The aim of the instrumental music program is to develop the students' musical, social and personal awareness through participation in instrumental music instruction, ensembles, rehearsals and performances.

Band Instruments Taught: Year 3*- 6

- Flute
- Clarinet
- Alto/Tenor Saxophone
- Bass Clarinet
- Trumpet
- Trombone
- Euphonium/Baby Tuba
- Percussion (drums, glockenspiel, auxiliary percussion)
- Keyboard only if being taught privately

Ensembles

The Instrumental Program is Ensemble based. All Students in the instrumental music program participate in an ensemble. Each Ensemble is like a sporting team with a variety of positions all of which must be filled for the team/ensemble to function.

Communication

All notice of performances and special events will be published in the School Newsletter.

^{*}Year 3 and physically smaller students may only be suitable for one of the following instruments which are available in modified models: Flute -curved head-joint; Trumpet; Cornet; Trombone (ergonomic model) or Percussion.

Enrolments, Fees & Lessons

Your child's enrolment in the Instrumental Music Program will continue from year to year whilst your child is in attendance at St Benedict's Primary School. It will not be necessary to re-enrol at the start of each year, however, if you wish your child to discontinue with the Program, a formal note of withdrawal will be required from you (parent/guardian) to Mr Smith/Admin prior to the end of semester to ensure further billing does not occur in the following semester.

Participation in the program is charged at a non-refundable flat rate of:

- \$135.00 for each term, (invoiced per term) for Senior Band
- \$270.00 for each semester, (invoiced per semester) for Junior Band

This single fee contributes towards group lessons, ensembles, competitions and associated resources. Consequently, lessons are not charged individually.

Once your child has started lessons you are financially committed to the instrumental music program for that whole semester (two terms).

During a term, lessons may be missed due to student or staff illness, other school activities etc. Such occurrences are to be expected and fees will not be adjusted for these reasons. In the event of long periods of absenteeism by staff or students, adjustment may be made at the discretion of the Principal.

Students joining the program will receive a 30-minute lesson on their chosen instrument, and one ensemble rehearsal each week.

Lessons take place in school time at the same scheduled time each week. Ensemble rehearsals take place out of school time – Senior Band (ie returning students) before school and Junior Band (ie new students) after school.

A successful program can only be maintained with the commitment of the staff and students. Continued absence from lessons, band and performances can cause problems within the lesson group or ensemble. A letter to explain absences would be appreciated.

Student Requirements

Instrument

You may purchase a new or pre-used instrument. Many retailers offer rental/purchase plans.

An instrument of good quality is vital to the success of the beginner student. For this reason, it is suggested that all second hand purchases be checked prior to purchase by the teacher or a reputable retailer.

It is strongly advised that all purchases (new and used) from EBay or the internet be avoided as some of these instruments are unplayable and the customer has no recourse. Repairers refuse to work on these instruments as they cannot guarantee the repairs.

A reputable retailer will offer you sound advice and backup service. Some retailers have been listed at the back of the booklet for your convenience.

Instrument Hire

In general, instruments are not provided by the school. All families will be responsible for the purchase, or hire, of their child's instrument, tutor book and accessories.

The School has purchased a few of the larger and more expensive instruments that are vital to the balance and success of the Ensembles. Children will be selected for these instruments in relation to criteria such as suitability for playing the instrument, interest and commitment (dedication to practice), intention to remain in the program and at St Benedict's until year 6.

School instruments will be hired to students at a cost of **\$70 per term** and include instruments such as Bass Clarinet and Tenor Saxophone. *On completion of the Instrument Hire Agreement, and prior to the instrument being returned to the School, the Hirer will be responsible to organise and pay for an instrument service by a reputable music retailer. A copy of the Service Receipt must also be returned to the School to verify that the instrument is in peak condition ready for the next Hirer.*

Commitment

Learning a musical instrument and being able to make music individually but also in a group situation, is one of the joys of the human experience. While the school offers this opportunity to students, a commitment is also required of them.

Performances

Students are required to play at performances in and out of the school throughout the year. Your attendance is important. A letter to explain absence from a performance must be given in advance.

Practice

Regular practice is important. Beginning students should start with about 15 minutes a day. One long practice session on the day of a lesson is virtually useless. Parents should ensure a set routine of practice is established at the beginning of the year.

Expectations of Students

- 1. Attend all lessons, band rehearsals and performances on time.
- 2. Practice regularly.
- 3. Care and maintain instrument and replace accessories as needed.
- 4. Bring instrument, band folder, books, pencil and other accessories for instrument to all lessons, band rehearsals and performances.
- 5. Assist with the setting up and packing up of band rehearsal and personal equipment.
- 6. Take home to parents all school and special music newsletters.
- 7. Attend all performances inside and outside school time.

Expectations of Parents

- 1. Advise the music teacher of child absence prior to lessons, rehearsals and performances.
- 2. Encourage child in his/her home practice.
- 3. Encourage child by attending performances in and out of school hours.
- 4. Support child in honoring the expectations above.
- 5. Ensure child has the necessary accessories to maintain and keep their instrument in good working order.
- 6. Read and take note of all school and special music newsletters that are sent home.
